



# Construction Industry Snapshot for WA1 JUNE 2018 2

# **Employment**

## The Industry employs 10.2% of the State Workforce

With 4.6% growth in May 2018 compared to May 2017.

# **Tradespeople**

## The industry employs over 67,800 tradespeople

The industry employs 4.3% more workers than it did 12 months ago.

## **Apprenticeships**

# The industry employers 44% of the State's apprentices

Including electrical, there are currently 6,764 apprentices 'in training' which is a 2.9% decrease on the previous year but there has been a 68.4% reduction in apprenticeship cancellations. There has been a 4.8% decrease in Construction apprenticeship commencements with an increase in Electrical apprentice commencements of 16.6%.

# **Traineeships**

## The industry employs 804 trainees.

Since 2009 there has been a 71% increase in Traineeships especially in the Civil Construction sector

# Building Approvals and Commencements 3

# **Building Approvals**

### Total Dwelling Units - there was a total of 18,534 approvals for all types of Dwelling Units

This was a reduction of 7.7% on the previous year to May 2018. However, over the period April to May 2018, approvals have decreased by 0.6%.

#### Total Houses – there was a total of 13,747 approvals for houses

This was a reduction of 8.1% in the year to May 2018 and a reduction of 8.0% in the last quarter with a 9% decrease over the period April to May 2018.

#### **Dwelling Commencements**

In the year to December 2017 there was a total of 19,634 dwelling commencements.

## Construction Work Done

### Residential – decrease of 2.7% in value in the last guarter to \$6.16B

This shows an improvement in activity in the last quarter compared against a reduction of 15.5% on the previous twelve months.

## Non-Residential – a decrease of 20.1% in the last quarter to \$4.81B

This was against an increase of 7.6% in the previous twelve months. This is an improvement on the year to March 2017 when there was an 8.6% decrease in work done.
