

Key outcomes of the BCIT Board Meeting

Held 10 June 2022

- The meeting received a presentation from the Director General of the Department of Training and Workforce Development. The meeting discussed the challenges the industry is facing in terms of skills shortages and re-employment of apprentices on the challenges currently facing the industry in relation to training and skills shortages.
- The CEO Tiffany Allen advised that she will be participating in the CEO Sleepout again this year to promote awareness around the issue of homelessness. Mental health support for the industry was discussed and the opportunity for the CTF to engage broader to ensure supports are available.
- The Board discussed the high priority issues and the focus on key areas that require attention due to their volatility or uncertainty. It was acknowledged that even though the administrative impact of the COVID 19 policies had reduced the overall impact of the pandemic is still significant with all ready constrained workforce.
- The meeting discussed the CTF organisational structure and supported the required changes to ensure that all stakeholders of the CTF were being serviced efficiently and effectively noting the increased level of governance and integrity being undertaken by the agency.
- The meeting discussed how to encourage collaboration across all sectors of the building and construction industry to develop safety awareness training around silicosis awareness. The Board are very supportive of awareness programs and that the need to ensure they are reflective of every sector in the building and construction industry.
- The Board reviewed the first-year outcomes of the CTF Strategic Plan 2021-2025 "Built to Skill" and the good progress made on the initiatives. In conjunction, the Board reviewed the Strategic Risk Register ensuring treatment actions are appropriate and whether any additional risks need to be captured.
- The meeting discussed a proposed Levy Strategy and Framework which will guide the CTF and the Board in delivering its objectives under the Act.
