Estimators are responsible for providing estimate costs for residential, commercial or civil construction projects. A determination of project size and even whether a project goes ahead or not is based on the detailed associated costs provided by the estimator. Estimators consider expenses for things like materials, labour, land and equipment.

What might a working day look like? May perform tasks including:

Every day is different and varies depending on the job, but you may be involved in:

- Identifying and producing estimated costs for building and construction projects
- Working with managers to evaluate the scope, value and timeframe of projects and budgets
- Preparing, evaluating and lodging tender documentation
- Creating and interpreting plans, drawings and other documents
- Incorporating building codes and standards into the construction costs
- Managing and monitoring budgets for existing projects
- Estimating the equipment, manpower and materials required to complete a job
- Ensuring job specifications and standards are met and can work to a deadline

Skills and personal qualities


- Be able to understand technical drawings and plans

How to get started

Entry into this occupation can begin by enrolling into a Certificate II in Building and Construction (Para Professional Pathway) pre-apprenticeship. Once completed you can then move on to complete a Certificate IV in Building Project Support (Estimator).
