Schedulers are responsible for organising projects so that plans are in place, the machinery arrives on cue, there are adequate tradespeople and managers to perform certain tasks and the necessary materials arrive on site and on time. They work to deadlines and ensure the project is completed within budget.

- Managing current and future budgets of the project
- Ensuring job specifications and standards are met
- Working to a deadline

Entry to this occupation is by completion of a pre-apprenticeship course to gain a Certificate II in Building and Construction—Para-Professional (Business) Pathway which can lead into a traineeship with a building company. You can then further your studies with a Certificate IV in Building and Construction (Estimator).
