Excursion Information

The Construction Futures Centre caters for audiences from Year 9 through to Year 12 and is an interactive venue with a range of exhibits that highlight the careers available in Western Australia's building and construction industry and demonstrates the industry's significance to the economic and social wellbeing of the State.

Visits to the Construction Futures Centre can be tailored to suit age groups and subject requirements and presents a range of learning experiences that support the Australian Curriculum, particularly in STEM areas. Entry into the Construction Futures Centre is free.

The Construction Futures Centre is not open to the public and only single bookings of up to 40 students. Students are not permitted to leave the building during the excursion.



Supervision

It is a requirement that schools provide a supervisory team for excursions to the Construction Futures Centre. The preferred ratio is 1:10 for Years 9 -10 and 1:15 Year 11-12. The school supervisors must accompany students throughout the excursion, actively monitor behaviour and intervene as necessary.

Construction Futures Centre facilitators will direct and assist students throughout the excursion; however, will not assume responsibility for student management or supervision. We may be required to intervene where behaviour or activity presents a risk to the safety of individuals and/or the integrity of exhibits.

Transport/Parking

Transport and transport costs to and from the Construction Futures Centre is the responsibility of the visiting school. Buses can enter via the Belgravia Street entrance and park in bus port on right hand side of the building at the centre entrance.

Buses can remain parked in the undercover area during the excursion or depart via the Hubert Street exit.

Environment/Accessibility

The Construction Futures Centre is located at 104 Belgravia Street, Belmont and comprises two floors of exhibit space with stairs and elevator available. The theatre includes a hearing loop. Toilets (including accessible toilet) are on the ground floor of the exhibition space. A first-aid facility is available.

There are no facilities for students to purchase and/or eat food on the premises.

Emergency Response Plan

The Construction Futures Centre has an Emergency Response Plan which includes trained wardens, evacuation maps and routes, clearly marked exits and fire hydrant equipment. In the event of an emergency, it is essential that all school visitors take directions from facilitators who will manage evacuation of the building and direct students and supervisors to assemble at a safe muster point.

Supervisors will need to do a roll call and must immediately notify facilitators if any students are missing. It is recommended that supervisory teams have access to a list of names of participating students, supervisors' contact telephone numbers, student medical information and relevant health information of supervisors.

Facilitators have first aid training; however, it is the responsibility of the excursion supervisors to administer basic first aid to the students.

Public Liability Insurance

The Construction Futures Centre is insured by RiskCover. The limit of cover is \$800,000,000. The Certificate of Currency is included at the end of this document.

Construction Training Fund (CTF) are partnering with The Centre for Social Impact University of Western Australia (CSI UWA) to evaluate the impact of the Construction Futures Centre (CFC) on young visitors.

During your visit, there will be opportunities to participate in short research data collection activities. The purpose is to collect data that will inform an evaluation of the CFC and to provide insights on how it can be improved to better inform and engage visitors. Participation is anonymous and voluntary; it is not mandatory. There will be no consequences for choosing not to participate. The following research opportunities will be present during the visit:

Short survey questions

Exhibits may be accompanied by an electronic tablet device with short survey questions. Visitors will have the opportunity to provide their reactions towards an exhibit – captured by the survey questions.

Interviews with teachers

UWA researcher may contact teachers after their visit to conduct a short interview. This will help to provide qualitative input on how students are responding to the CFC and its exhibits. Participation time is expected to take no longer than 20 minutes and would be conducted online or via phone after your visit.

End of visit survey

At the conclusion of the visit, an opportunity will be given to fill out a more comprehensive survey about the visitor's experience. This survey will provide deeper insight into which exhibits were most engaging and will also be an opportunity for visitors to provide feedback on the CFC.

Optional eye tracking

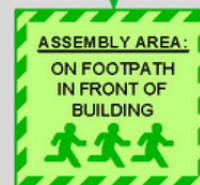
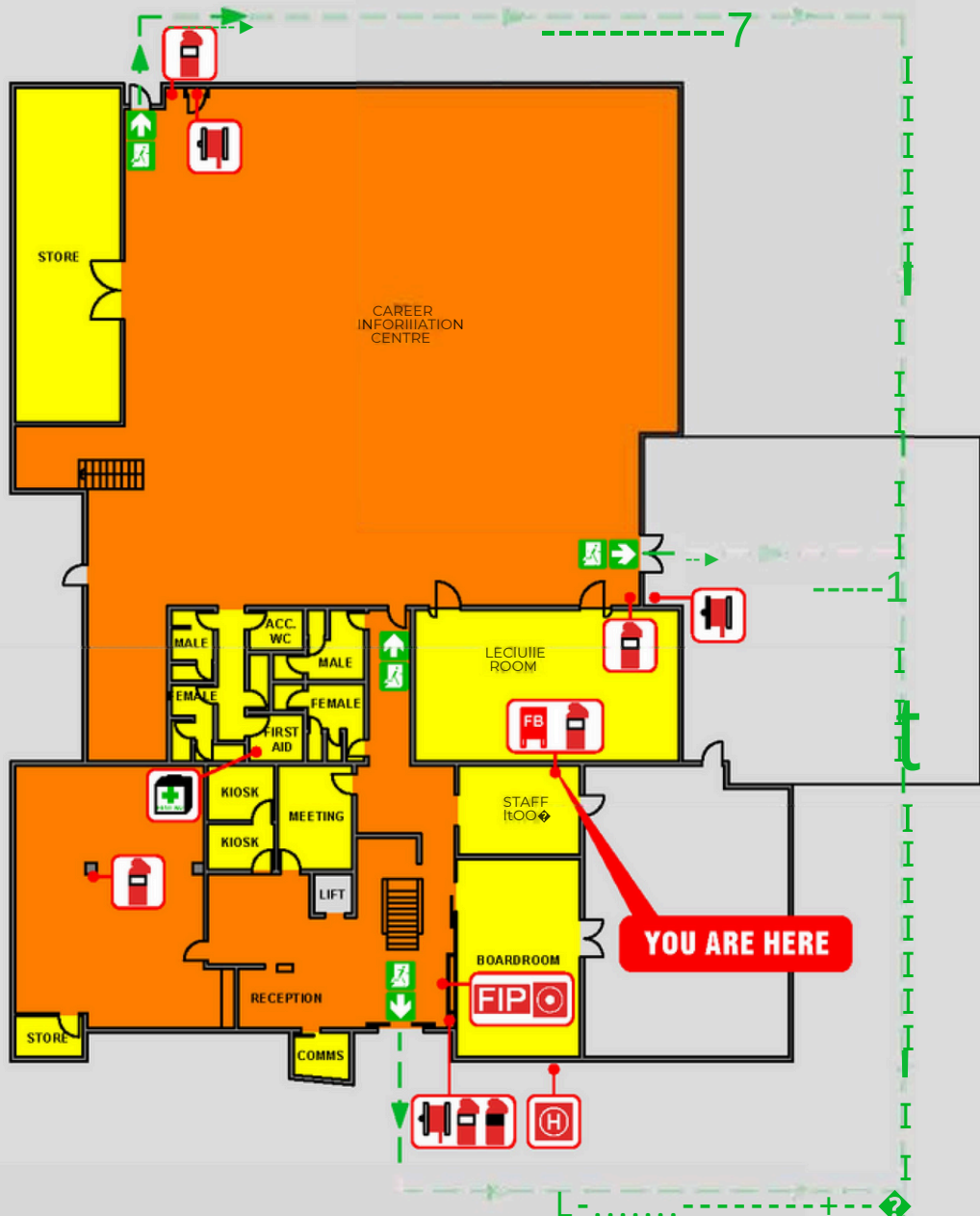
UWA researchers present at the centre may be conducting eye tracking research which involves the participant wearing a small headset to track where their eyes are focusing on the exhibit. The data is completely anonymous; no identifying information will be collected. The data will only highlight where the participant is looking. We will provide participants with this information beforehand and ask them for verbal consent before using the headset. UWA researchers will be present at all times for eye tracking and will be able to answer any questions.

Observation

UWA research may be present making observations of student engagement. However, this will not require direct interaction with students and will involve recording the numbers of students at exhibits and their assumed genders. All researchers will have valid Working With Children Cards.

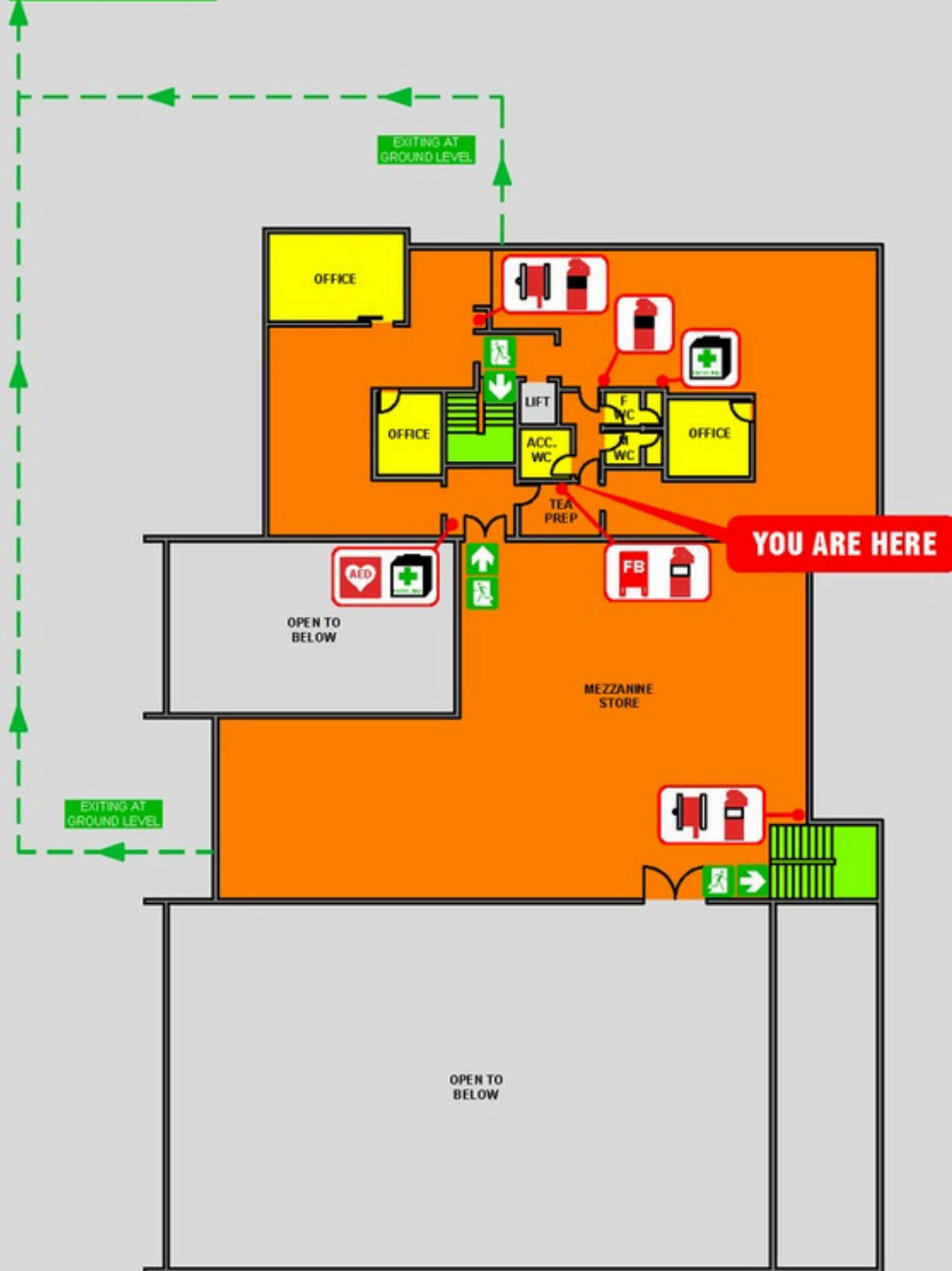

(EXITING AT GROUND FLOOR)










